(WASHINGTON, D.C.) -- Today, Congressional Quarterly Weekly – a non-partisan, Capitol Hill publication – identified U.S. Congressman Jason Altmire (PA-04) as having one of the most independent voting records in Congress. Throughout his career, Altmire has consistently been identified as one of Congress’s most independent Members. Indeed, in March of 2009, another non-partisan, Capitol Hill publication – National Journal – identified Altmire as having one of the most centrist voting records in Congress.

Altmire has never missed a single vote during the three years he has served in Congress.

“When I came to Congress, I promised that I would work with both Republicans and Democrats to put in place policies that can help western Pennsylvania families,” Altmire said. “I am proud that over the last three years, I have kept that promise. My decision to vote for or against a certain bill will always be based on what that bill will do for western Pennsylvania, not whether it was written by a Republican or a Democrat.”
