Today, U.S. Congressman Jason Altmire (PA-4) cast his 4,000th consecutive vote in the U.S. House of Representatives, an unbroken streak that began on his first day in office on January 4, 2007.

Currently in his third term, Altmire has never missed a vote during his four and a half years in office. He remains the only Member of Congress to have made every vote called during the past three sessions of Congress. Altmire's 4000 vote streak is by far the longest of any current member of Congress.

Altmire's 4000th vote came on House Roll Call vote 469, an amendment to the Jobs and Energy Permitting Act (H.R. 2021). The amendment failed 183-238.
